Staff Reports: Debra distributed the July 2007 monthly report. (See Report)

In response to questions asked at the last meeting, Debra reported that the June Soccer Camp had 20 participants, the July Camp had 23, and the August Camp had 18. The majority of those registered were in the Recreation Camp.

Debra also reported that the trail paving project at York Township Park had been initially set for 2008. The Board discussed the pros and cons of paving the whole trail as opposed to only those areas that tend to wash out. The Board asked Debra to get a cost estimate on paving the full trail with a macadam surface.

Debra reported that the EAC was working on various projects at Mill Creek Preserve with different Eagle Scouts—a bridge ramp, an information kiosk, a gravel parking lot with an entrance that would align with Old Dutch Lane. The EAC was also planning to hold a class in conjunction with the York WAY Weekend.

Old Business: Stump Park—The project is still in a holding pattern regarding the plan approval from the National Park Service. The Land Development process will begin in early 2008.

Markey Park—The playground equipment has been selected and the Land Development plans will be reviewed by staff in late August before being sent to the York Township Planning Commission.

Ma & Pa Community Greenway—The joint committee received a \$15,000 grant from York County's Inter-Governmental Grant Program to assist with the Feasibility Study. The committee is also planning a trail walk in Harford County, MD along portions of the Ma & Pa Railroad corridor that it has already transformed into a trail.

Park Renaming—Debra presented comments that she had received from two Commissioners regarding the process of renaming a park in honor of

someone. The Board decided to wait on making any formal recommendation until more Commissioners had been contacted.

New Business:

NRPA Congress—The Board approved travel to the NRPA Congress for Debra.

Non-Resident Fee (NFR) for Sports Organizations—Debra reported that she had been reviewing the policies of other organizations and would present a proposal at the September meeting.

Other:

Dean reported that the Living Word Community Church may be developing a portion of its land for recreational use and might contact Debra regarding some kind of agreement for the Township to use also if we are interested.
